Focus and scope

The Economic Journal of Nepal publishes theoretical and empirical work in economics that uses contemporary methods and carries academic and policy significance. The journal has appeared quarterly since 1977 and welcomes research and analytical articles along with book reviews. Every issue is freely available on Nepal Journals Online at nepjol.info/index.php/EJON.

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Check each of the following. Submissions that fail these conditions may be returned without review.

- The work has not been published elsewhere and is not under consideration by another journal.
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- The text is set in 12-point Times New Roman with 1.5 line spacing.
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- Illustrations, figures and tables sit within the text at the points where they belong, not collected at the end.
- The manuscript follows the stylistic and bibliographic requirements set out below.
- DOIs are supplied for references wherever they are available, including for open access versions.
- The manuscript has been carefully proofread.

Manuscript preparation

Language and length

- Papers must be written in English.
- Maximum 6,000 words. Tables, annexes, footnotes, endnotes and references fall outside this count.

Layout

- Microsoft Word file.
- 12-point Times New Roman, 1.5 line spacing.
- One inch margins on all four sides.

Abstract

- Roughly 150 words.
- Structured so that it mirrors the paper's main findings and conclusions.

Equations, figures and notes

- Type equations and formulas in an editable format. Do not paste them as images.
- Supply diagrams and figures in editable form, placed within the text where they apply.
- Number endnotes sequentially and place them at the end of the paper.

References and citations

- Follow the latest edition of the American Psychological Association (APA) style for both in-text citations and the reference list.
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Structure of the paper

Organise the manuscript in the order below and keep each section within its indicative range.

Section	Indicative length	What it should cover
Introduction and background	700 to 1,100 words	Background and motivation for the study set against the literature; the research objectives; a brief account of the method, data and findings; how the paper is organised.
Literature review	1,200 to 1,500 words	A synthesis of the relevant work, the gap it leaves, and what this paper adds.
Data and method	700 to 1,000 words	Research design and theoretical framework; whether the data are primary or secondary, their nature and the sampling strategy; collection technique for primary data, or source and coverage for secondary data; tools and techniques of analysis; model specification and the reasoning behind the variables; the identification strategy where selection is a concern.
Results and discussion	1,500 to 2,000 words	Descriptive results, then inferential results with supporting tables and graphs; interpretation of the findings; limitations; internal and external validity.
Conclusion and recommendation	500 to 700 words	A summary of the objective, data and method; the key findings and what they amount to; policy recommendations where they apply; limitations and directions for further research.
References and appendix	Outside the word count	Reference list in current APA style, followed by any appendix material.
