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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This annual EMIS report 2023/2024, shows the status of higher education in Birgunj Nursing Campus (BNC). BNC has prepared the EMIS annual report in order to publish its basic academic statistical information. The main purpose of this annual report is to report on the database system of the campus that shows the current status of the campus. The report has been prepared as per the data available from different departments, administrative section and campus record.

BNC is a constituent campus of Tribhuvan University (TU), Institute of Medicine (IOM). It is offering bachelor level nursing program i.e. Bachelor in Nursing Science (BNS) and Bachelor Science in Nursing (BSc. Nursing). The total number enrolled were 67 in the year. Among them 27 were enrolled in BNS and 40 in BSc nursing program.

The total budget allocated for the year was Rs. 19951000, the capital expenditure is Rs. 38639219. The total number of faculty in the campus is 20. Most of the teacher have achieved master's degree and 2 faculty is PhD holder. The total number of non- teaching staffs is 22. Among them one officer 9 are assistant staffs and remaining 12 are supporting staffs.

BNC published its volume of journal JBNC and other publications like annual report, academic audit report etc. are published on regular basis. Recently, BNC has provided mini research grant and student's research support grant.

SECTION- 1: INTRODUCTION

The Birgunj Nursing Campus has undertaken the task of publishing basic statistical information about the higher education through its annual publication in the form EMIS report. This report presents information about the higher education in the campus through comprehensive data. It is expected that the information in this report will be useful for planning, policy making, designing programs and projecting resources of the higher education with special reference to Birgunj Nursing Campus.

BNC established an Education Management Information System (EMIS) in 2022. Its aims to provide updated information of the education system in the campus. This is our first attempt to bring out such a comprehensive report of statistical information. The main purpose of this volume is to provide adequate, accurate, timely and reliable data to the education stakeholders.

This report comprises information about BNC, student enrolment, pass graduates, teaching and non-teaching staffs, academic department and programs, research and publication, financial status of the campus.

1.1 Organization of the report

There are ten sections in the report; first section provides introduction of the report, second section provides background information on subjects and specialties in the campus. Section three gives student's enrolment status. Section four provides information on graduates from the campus. Section five presents information on financial aspects of the campus. Section six provides the details of teaching and nonteaching staff. Section seven presents information students-teachers ratio and workload for faculty. Section eight gives the information about research and publications of faculty. Section nine gives the information regarding scholarship details for students. The last section presents the detail of ICT report of the campus.

1.2 Methodology

The data were collected from the administrative sections of the campus. The data obtained are presented in a simple table and figure as and when necessary. Descriptive statistics are used for the analysis of data.

SECTION-2: FACULTY AND DEPARTMENT

Birgunj Nursing Campus offers excellent teaching learning and research environments in a wide-ranging various nursing fields. Its academic offers excellence across disciplines and around the country. The college has two academic programs (BSc. nursing and BNS). BSc. Nursing is a four year course and BNS is a three year course. BNS has specialty in Community, Paediatric and Adult Health Nursing. In each program there is year wise coordinator. There are three departments are in progress i.e. Adult Nursing, Midwifery department and Community health nursing department according to rules of TU, IOM.

Bachelor of Nursing Science Program

The post Basic Bachelor of Nursing (PBBN) program was initiated in the Birgunj Nursing Campus in 2011 AD (2068 BS) with the duration of 2 years with major Hospital nursing. The objectives were to prepare nurses who would be flexible and adaptable to any area of nursing practice. The curriculum was further revised and made it a three years program in 2013 AD (2070 BS) with provision for core courses in the first and second year and some major courses in the third year. The curriculum also included Basic Health Science courses, Comprehensive English and computer application and program was renamed as Bachelor of Nursing Science (BNS) program which was implemented from the year 2014 in BNC.

Midwifery Department : In midwifery department there are altogether five faculty who have done masters in Women Health and Development which fulfils the criteria for departments. There is 1 lecturer, and 4 assistant lecturer in this department. Campus has forwarded letter for approval of department head to the Dean Office.

Adult Health Nursing Department: Likewise, in adult nursing there are altogether eight faculty who have done master in Adult Health which fulfils the criteria for departments. Among those faculty 1 is Associate Professor and 7 are teaching assistant. Recently, campus has forwarded letter for approval of department head to the Dean Office.

Community Health nursing department: There are altogether 5 faculty in community health nursing department. Among them 2 faculty are teaching assistant and 3 are in instructor post. . Recently, campus has forwarded letter for approval of department head to the Dean Office.

Course Offered

The objectives of the program of this campus is to produce middle and higher level nursing care providers, Managers and leaders who are capable of independent judgment, functioning in a leadership positions in the hospital and community; teaching the junior students and conduct research in areas of nursing.

There is cent percent pass rate in 2077/78 academic year, 98% pass result in 078/079 academic year, and 86 % of students passed in academic year 2079/080, 25% pass result in academic year 2080/081.

SECTION 5: FINANCIAL ASPECT OF THE CAMPUS

This campus has been conducting the two programs of under graduate level of Bachelor in Nursing (BNS) and Bachelor Science in Nursing. The legal provision for conducting the program, scholarship of 75% of students and full payment of 25% of students under common entrance examination held by National Medical Education Commission, Ministry of Health and Population, Ministry of Education and Technology and Institute of Medicine (TU) has been regulated since the 2076/2077 academic year, and our college has gotten the opportunity to take the responsibility of those students.

Maximum part of the budget has to be used for salaries, scientific tools and equipment, repair and maintenance, Telephone and internet charges, electricity charges and so on. University provides the grant only for salaries and provident fund. All the academic, administrative and infrastructure expenses are borne by internal sources. In addition to the grant provided by TU, National Medical Education Commission of Nepal government also provides the grant to those 75% students selected for the scholarship which equals to the expenses of those students admitted with full payment.




Fig. 6.1 Full time faculties according to specialization in subjects




Figure 6.2 Distribution of faculty according to their education level

Table 6.3 shows that 40% of the faculties are appointed as teaching assistant, whereas there are only 5% faculties are Associate Professor.




Figure 6.3 Distribution of Teaching Faculties

Fig 6.3 shows that among 30 faculties majority (60%) are full time and 40% are on part time basis.




Figure 6.4 Distribution of Non-teaching staff according to according to their position

SECTION 8: RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION

Research Management Cell (RMC) in the campus deals with research, trainings and publication activities through its committee. This cell provides opportunity for those faculties engaged in research activities by providing fund for their research. The campus supports students by providing orientation on how to conduct research and write reports. The students have the opportunity to work alongside experienced faculty members in a variety of settings. Together, they work to find solutions to the most critical health problems. The research management cell has a separate well-furnished office. This cell was established to serve the faculty members and students to enhance their academic and research capabilities and to provide resources for conducting research activities. In addition, the cell coordinates, supervises evaluates research activities of the faculty members and students. The current research management cell comprises of 5 members. The RMC reports to the IQAC Chair person.

Recently, the campus has made provision of granting seed money for mini research for each department worth Rs. 50,000 whereas to support student in their research RMC has allocated 5,000 for 2 students from each BNS and BSc. Nursing program. Grant selection committee is formed to evaluate the proposals presented in RMC for research grant purpose.

The publication committee regularly publishes prospectus, academic calendar, annual report and so on. Currently in 2023 the campus published journal under the name of Journal of Birgunj Nursing Campus which is a peer reviewed journal.

Campus is using EMIS software for data collection and smooth running of campus activities.

E-Mail and Internet

Students as well as staff of the Birgunj Nursing Campus can easily obtain an email id with domain name bnc.edu.np. Besides that, Tribhuvan University also has provided TU official email accounts for every teachers, student and staff.

Birgunj Nursing Campus has a total dedicated NTC bandwidth of 35 Mbps. Campus is providing fully dedicated wired and wireless internet facility to the hostels, all the departments and residence. Campus also provides a free Wi-Fi zone for teachers and students in campus library.

EMIS Soft ware

Birgunj Nursing Campus is using EMIS software for data collection and smooth running of campus activities. It is a web based system so that users can access it using their account from any place where the internet is available. All the data in the system is highly secured in the cloud applying the best security policy. All the academic information related to students and staff is recorded in software. Financial work is done through the system where all the fee information of students is stored. The system is also running in the Library where all the information like Book records, book received & delivered by students and teachers are stored. Smart barcode system is used for proper functioning in the Library. Moreover, campus administrative as well as stock information can be stored in this system.

E-attendance

The attendances of all the teaching and non-teaching staffs are maintained by the use of Biometric Attendance Device that reads Eye retina. This device is linked with our EMIS system on campus for the attendance report. There is a provision of online submission for leave.

Computer & Accessories

This is the era of technology. Birgunj Nursing Campus gives more priority to technology for a better education system. Every department uses computers for their regular work. Campus has about 16 computers, 4 laptops and 6 printers which are currently in use. Classes are well equipped with multimedia projectors as well as in the meeting and conference hall.
