# **SECTION: ONE**

## **INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 Historical Background**

Established in 2019, Dhawalagiri Multiple Campus (DMC) stands as one of the prides of the people of Dhawalagiri area. The establishment of DMC is the outcome of the community aspiration combined with an integrated effort of the people of Dhawalagiri area.

DMC is located at the centre of Baglung Municipality, the erstwhile headquarter city of Dhawalagiri zone and the cross-section of Kaligandaki corridor highway and Mid-hilly Highway that transverse much part of the catchment area of the campus. The prime location of the campus has enhanced its institutional accessibility so as to quench the thirst of higher education.

In the initial phase of its establishment, the classes of DMC were conducted in the night shift in the school building of Vidyamandir High School, a reputed school of Baglung Bazaar as well as one of the feeder schools at present. DMC has owned about 88 ropanies of land and constructed different types of buildings for the academic, administrative and residential purpose.

A careful blend of traditional physical structure with more contemporary techniques of learning is a key to attract the students from diverse background with diverse aims. The oldest building of DMC, traditionally designed, slate roofed classroom building with four classrooms and a traditional sports hall/meeting hall, was constructed in the beginning. In addition to this building in the upper premise, Law Block, Science Block, BBA Block, canteen and FSU office building have been constructed as part the infrastructural development plan of the campus. The library building in the upper premise is under construction. Other buildings, constructed in the lower premise, includes Boys Hostel, Teacher/Staff accommodation and newly constructed Ladies Hostel.

DMC was included as the constituent campus of TU in 2030 BS and the financial burden for the operation of the campus decreased a bit. Afterwards, the blended plan was formulated for the extension and upgrading of academic programmes along with the development of physical

infrastructure. Despite various challenges, DMC has kept on implementing the plan. The introduction of autonomy (in 2078), has placed the campus in better position specially for the utilization of resources.

DMC has underscored on imparting quality education for preparing competent citizens ready to face challenges in the days to come. The campus has endeavored to integrate student-oriented and globally-applied pedagogical strategies to enable the students to face the local, national and international challenges. The campus has attempted to maintain enhanced learning resources and develop a culture of learning and research.

DMC has a team of dedicated faculty members with diverse academic background to deal with academic issues. The practice of teaching technique that integrates latest pedagogy with the use of technical equipment has been the integral part of quality enhancement initiatives. Most of the classes are equipped with multimedia projectors and teachers have been trained to use them. Students have responded positively after the initiation of multimedia-based tutorial activities.

The overall composition of the tutorial program is oriented to preparing students for high-level professional responsibilities. Because of these approaches, DMC has produced professionally proficient graduates who have held eminent position in bureaucratic, academic, commercial and socio-political fields throughout the country and outside as well. More than 2100 students in different faculties and streams are currently studying at DMC. The classes of BA, BEd, BBS, BBA and BSc in bachelor level and MBS, MA sociology, MA Nepali, MEd Nepali, MEd Curriculum and MEd English are running in the campus.

On the basis of operational calendar prepared by the campus, the campus has been conducting internal examination in two different phases in all the levels (annual and semester). Based on the students' results of the internal examination, the campus has initiated providing necessary feedback through remedial classes focusing on slow learner. The students have been immensely benefited in improving their academic achievements through these activities.

Student Quality Circle has been formed in most of the classes for involving students in quality enhancement initiatives. The extra-curricular activities including oratory contest, quiz contest, poem recitation, cultural shows/ through singing/dancing contest, and sports competitions such as basketball, volleyball, football, table tennis and many other activities have been conducted on regular schedule. Students are encouraged to participate in different social activities in order to promote the sense of civic responsibilities and social services in them.

DMC has assessed its weaknesses and challenges and formulated short term, midterm and long-term plans compiled in five-year strategic plans. The first five-year strategic plan strategic (2073/74-078/79) has successfully been executed and the second strategic plan (2079/80-083/84) has been formulated to speed up planned improvement initiatives focusing on educational, administrative and infrastructural aspects.

The principle aim of the improvement initiatives is to maintain and sustain eligibility to Quality Assurance and Accreditation (QAA) program that the University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched with the aim of improving quality of higher education in Nepal. In line with QAA mission, Quality Enhancement Mechanism (QEM) has been introduced. The mechanism is composed of the committees consisting of all the faculties and staffs assigned with distinct responsibility. The faculties and staffs of all the departments and sections are collectively working as the systematized unit to accomplish the job defined through ToR. The committees formed under QEM has proved to be an effective strategy to implement enhanced teamwork system.

The campus has made some noticeable changes in academic, administrative and physical aspects. Installation of EMIS software, digitalization of academic records of all the students, faculties and staffs, introduction of remedial and non-credit course classes, resourceful library with e-resources, well scheduled extra-curricular activities, better maintained science lab, computer lab and cultural lab, varieties of sports facility with wide playground, hostel facility for needy students, wide publicity of campus activities and information through prospectus, brochure, bulletin, website, face book page, digital notice board and Campus Charter and much more are outcome of the improvement initiatives that have broadly enhanced the learning environment and attracted the perspective students.

DMC has enhanced the culture of research and publication. Annual Publication of 'Dhawalagiri Journal of Sociology/Anthropology' (Nepjol indexed one star rated online and hard copy publication), 'Pragyasarathi' (recently upgraded to Nepjol indexed peer reviewed publication with DOI), 'Dhawalagiri Journal of Contemporary Issues' (Nepjol indexed peer reviewed journal with DOI) are the commendable achievement on research and publication. DMC has maintained research-friendly environment through the provision of research workshop/seminar for the faculties, incentives for research and encouragement for further study (MPhil and PhD).

DMC has further plan to upgrade the institutional performance through the integration of modern methods of teaching, learning and research culture, consistent and credible assessment and evaluation system, proper management of human resources and physical facilities, collaboration with other academic institution, promotion of the accessibility and affordability to higher education targeting to various marginalized section of the society, institutional practice of quality culture, provision of efficient academic, administrative and financial mechanism and implement the plan rigorously.

No. enrolled students in different year




A detailed assessment of student enrollment trends spanning from the years 2075 to 2080 reveals dynamic shifts in academic preferences and program popularity. The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) program experienced a slight growth in student numbers, soaring from 31 enrollments in 2075 but this rate fell in 2080 batch. The total number of students in this program is 137 by 2080, as the number of students in 2075 in BBA first semester was 33 whereas the number of students in 2080 in BBA first batch is 28. Similarly, the Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS) program demonstrated consistent growth, peaking at 988 enrollments in total in 2080, suggesting sustained enthusiasm for business-related studies among students.

Meanwhile, the Bachelor of Science (BSc) program witnessed fluctuating enrollments, reaching its apex at 114 (the total number of students from first to fourth year) students in 2080, reflecting varying levels of interest in scientific disciplines. Conversely, the Bachelor of Education (BEd) program consistently attracted high numbers of students throughout the period, with a peak of 755 enrollments in 2078, and the number of total enrolled students in 2075 in BEd was 347 (in the first and second year), indicating a steady growth in BEd programme.

Additionally, the Bachelor of Arts (BA) program exhibited overall increasing enrollments, reaching a zenith of 121 students in 2079 before experiencing a slight decline in 2080. Among Master's programs, enrollments fluctuated, with disciplines like Education, English, and Sociology showing consistent growth, reflecting heightened interest in advanced studies within these fields. These enrollment trends collectively underscore the evolving participation of the students, characterized by shifting student preferences and the institution's proactive response to meet the demands of its students.



**Status of student enrollment (Programs of Semester System)**



## Section: Four

### Gender Parity Index

Gender parity index (GPI) generally indicates to equal participation of girls and boys in educational institution. Gender parity in enrollment is a key indicator of educational institutions for planning and policy formulation and implementation. It is calculated by dividing the female value of an indicator by the male value for the given level of education.

The formula for calculating GPI is:

GPI for given year = Girls' Value in given year/Boys' Value in given year

If the value of GPI is one (1) that indicates parity between the genders. GPI that varies between zero (0) to one (1) means a disparity in favor of boys, and if GPI is greater than one (1) indicates a disparity in favor of girls. As GPI value of 1 is highly unlikely. An increase in the GPI indicates that girls' enrollment or completion has improved or that boys' enrollment or completion has decreased.



Description of teachers



Analysis of the institution's funding sources from 2075 to 2080 reveals dynamic shifts in financial reliance and diversification strategies. The grants from the University Grants Commission (UGC), constituted a substantial portion of the budget, with their share of 53.27% in 2078/79 before slightly decreasing in the subsequent year. Initially, the campus experienced fluctuations and a notable decline in their contribution by 2079/80, indicating a challenge in sustaining external support. Revenue from fees for regular programs remained consistent but surged in 2079/80, suggesting a growing reliance on student contributions.

Furthermore, revenue from non-financial assets exhibited a steady rise, reflecting the institution's efforts to leverage its assets for additional income. Other revenue sources, including interest and wood selling, also saw increases in their budgetary share, indicating attempts to diversify income streams. Despite fluctuations, the institution's total funding increased over the years, underlining proactive measures to enhance financial sustainability through a mix of government grants, student fees, asset utilization, and alternative revenue sources. The data indicated that the campus needs to generate external contributions and internal revenue streams to ensure stable funding.

## Section: Eight

### Unit Cost and Student Teacher Ratio of the Institution

#### 8.1 Unit Cost of the Campus

Unit cost means per unit cost. Generally, unit cost represents the total expense for one student. It can be calculated dividing total annual expenditure budget (actual) by the number of students enrolled in reporting year to students. 

## **Section: Ten**

### **Details of Free-ship and Scholarships**

As per the provision of TU, twenty percent students are provided with free ship facility out of the total students admitted in the regular (funded by TU) programs. Three scholarship funds have been founded in the campus by the well-wishers/donors of this campus in the name of their parents/kith and kin. Similarly, two funds founded outside the campus have also been awarding scholarship to the students of this campus. FNCCI Baglung has been awarding the scholarship (Cash five thousand Rs.) to the topper students to management faculty of this campus. The government institution and others like District Coordination Committee, Dalit Commission have been providing scholarship to the students who are financially weak, disabled, dalit, janajati and marginalized. Such provision of free ship and scholarship facilities has benefitted the needy and outstanding students.

Twenty percent students enrolled in the regular programme of TU (BA, BEd) and self-financed programme (BBS) are granted free ship as per the TU rule and the free ship has been distributed in the former years. Similarly, class topper students have been felicitated and provided the scholarship. Free ship provision for the self-financed programmes have been introduced and scholarship provision have been increased.

Dhawalagiri Multiple Campus Scholarship Selection Committee decided to distribute free-ship and scholarships for the year 2078. According to the rules of the university, there is a provision that 20 percent of the students enrolled in the regular academic program of the campus must be given scholarships. For this, earlier the campus called upon the students to fill the application form. As the required students did not apply within the specified time, it was decided to give full scholarship to all the applied students subject to the scholarship distribution procedure prepared by the campus.

### 10.1 Details of students receiving free-ship and scholarships

The scholarship announced this year is for the academic year 2078. The campus has asked for applications again for 2079. 20% of the students enrolled in Humanities and Sociology and Education Faculty and 10% of the Management Faculty are providing scholarships to the regular programs of the University. Due to the previous year's covid-19 epidemic, the scholarship for 2077 could not be regularized. For the year 2077, the details of 153 students who received scholarships from various faculties towards the graduation level of the campus are as follows:
