2. Teaching Experience

After joining Mahendra Morang Adarsha Multiple Campus (MMAMC), Biratnagar, Nepal, the constituent campus of Tribhuvan University in 1982, I taught different courses in intermediate, Bachelor and Master's program. My teaching track was cleared only after my transfer from MMAMC to Prithwi Narayan Campus (PNC), another constituent campus of Tribhuvan University. At the beginning, I taught Elements of Finance in intermediate program and Banking and Insurance in Bachelor program at PNC. I started to teach Master's students in 1991. I taught FIN 508 (core course of Master's in Business Administration) in the first year and Assets Management (specialization course of Master's in Business Administration) in the second year until I was selected for PhD course under the faculty development program of the university in 1993.

I taught FIN 508 (core course) in the first year of Master of Business Studies and FIN 632 (specialization course) in the second year after completing my PhD in 1997 until 1999 in which year I was on leave without pay for 3 years to work as a Financial Advisor to the

Second Tourism Infrastructure Development Project (a project financed by Asian Development Bank). I returned to PNC in June 2001 and started to teach the same subjects till 2007 in which year I was appointed as a Vice Chancellor of Pokhara University (PU) for four year term. I supervised and guided the students pursuing their Master's dissertation.

I completed my four year tenure of Vice Chancellor in June 2011 and returned to PNC. This time I did not teach but supervised the students pursuing the research for their Master's dissertation till July 2012. I joined Herberger Business School, St. Cloud State University, St. Cloud, Minnesota, the U.S.A as a visiting professor of finance. After making back to Nepal from the U.S.A., I joined PNC and taught FIN 634: Financial Institutions and Markets and supervised Master research students and PhD students of PU and TU. Thus, I have intensive teaching experience in corporate finance (managerial finance/financial management) and financial institutions and markets both in undergraduate and post graduate programs. I served for Xinyu University, People Republic of China for two semesters (September 2017 to June 2018) as Professor of Finance and teaching Financial Management, Financial Statement Analysis, International Finance and Multinational Corporate Finance. In addition, I supervised foreign students conducting their research for their Graduate Thesis. I rejoined PNC in July 2018 and retired in September 2020 from Tribhuvan University. Now I am serving for UGC/Nepal and municipalities (Pokhara Metropolitan City and Tansen Municipality) intermittently. In addition, I am supervising 5 PhD students registered in Faculty of Management, Tribhuvan University even after retirement.

3. Professional Experiences

In addition to teaching experience, I have extensive professional experiences such as consultancy service experience, higher education administration and policy formulation experience as a Vice Chancellor and member of Nepal University Grants Commission. I worked as a Head, Department of Management Research Committee and Department of Finance and General Management; and member of finance subject committee of T.U and PU. Moreover, during 37 years of my career in higher education, I have extensive experience from very lower unit of higher education institution to highest institutions such as university senate and University Grants Commission. I am a founder executive editor of the Journal of Nepalese Business Studies; So, I have good experience in editing research articles also.

In addition, Nepal Open University Infrastructure Development Committee, Ministry of Education, Government of Nepal appointed me as a consultant to prepare the concept paper of Nepal Open University. I prepared the concept paper of Nepal Open University and sold the concept of Nepal Open University in various parts of Nepal. Nepal Open University has already come into existence. In addition to consultant, I served for Nepal Open University Infrastructure Development Committee as a coordinator of Curriculum Development Subcommittee and Open University Strategic Plan Sub-committee. I served for South Asian University (university established by SAARC Nations) as a member of selection committee in 2018.

I served for Ministry of Education, Science and Technology as member of Task Force formulated to draft the Higher Education Bill in 2076. At present, I am serving for EQAA Council, UGC, Nepal as an expert member.

4. Research Works

T.U is a teaching university. Nepal being one of the least developed countries, Nepal Government does not allocate enough budget for T.U and T.U. itself also can not generate much funds required for quality higher education and research. Nepal Government provides grants through university grants commission and it provides small grants to the faculties. Faculties do not get funds to enhance their knowledge in their career through research. In spite of this situation, I have completed some of the academic and applied researches under the mini research grants of the university. In addition, I have produced the research report as a consultant to Higher Education Project funded by the World Bank.

5. Publications

I have a number of research articles leading national journal such as Nepalese Management Review, The Journal of Nepalese Business Studies and Tribhuvan University Journal. One article was published in international journal—Sun Moon Law Journal.

In addition to the research articles, I have contributed to around dozen of finance text books for higher secondary students as a coauthor; and undergraduate and post graduate students of different universities. All text books are written in English. I have contributed in the areas of investment decision, derivatives, international finance, special topics of finance such as merger and acquisition.

6. Seminar Paper and Comment on Seminar Paper

I have written a number of papers on higher education and local government finance. I presented papers on higher education finance as a consultant of higher education and administrator of higher education institution. And I presented the paper on local government finance as a consultant of local government. Since, I worked as Financial Advisor to the project related to the municipal finance. Similarly as a faculty of finance, I presented paper on financial institutions. I got only one opportunity to attend and present the paper to the international seminar.

7. Supervision of PhD Students

One PhD student under my supervision has already received the degree and another has already submitted his thesis for internal evaluation. Currently 2 students are waiting for degree and 5 students are pursuing their study under my supervision.

As a Vice Chancellor of PU I got opportunities to visit many European, Asian and the U.S.A and their leading universities. Remarkable universities I visited are Oxford University, Cambridge University, London University, Harvard University, and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
