Nepalgunj Nursing Campus Nepalgunj

The school of nursing was first established in Kathmandu in 1956 under the directive of the health service, ministry of health. The first batch of this school had enrolled only 15 students. The expected proficiency of the produced manpower was illness oriented. Principally this was a Hospital oriented curriculum that was in effect between 1956 to 1986. This curriculum aims to prepare nurses to be efficient in fulfilling the health needs of the people of Nepal. With the introduction of the new educational system in 1972, nursing education was brought under the Institute of Medicine, Tribhuvan University. Nepalgunj Nursing campus is the only one constituent nursing campus of Tribhuvan University; Institute of medicine in Lumbini, Province. The Ministry of Health established ANM training school in 1969 in Nepalgunj. The school over a period of 17 years produced 406 ANMs. In 1987, it was upgraded to Proficiency Certificate Level (PCL) nursing campus. Since then it has produced 1153 PCL. Bachelor in Nursing (BN) programme was started which from 2011AD. The four year BSC nursing program has been running from 2021 AD in this Campus.
